## MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

I have been involved on a professional basis with the Flathead Land Trust for about 20 years. Recently, as I wean myself from my environmental consulting business and ease into retirement, I wanted to engage in volunteer work. Because of my experience with the Flathead Land Trust and their mission, I expressed an interest, and was elected to the Board of Directors, and now serve as Board President.

In November, the board and staff sequestered themselves for a weekend of strategic planning to assist us in establishing direction as we move forward. The plan establishes realistic goals and objectives consistent with our mission. The plan provides a base from which progress can be measured.

The planning process focused on defining the goals of the Flathead Land Trust and determining the resources necessary to achieve those goals. Achieving a vision requires coordinated efforts that adhere to a broader organizational plan. This is enabled through consistent strategies that are supported by staff and the board. The strategies outlined in our plan not only reach individual targets but collectively will strengthen the function of the Flathead Land Trust, and expand the awareness of the organization. The ultimate benefit of strategic planning would be that it contributes, in some measurable way, to improving overall organizational performance.

Your continued financial support of the Flathead Land Trust is paramount. We are at a very critical junction in the valley as we experience record growth and development. The population in Flathead County grew by roughly 2,000 people from 2015 to 2016, the largest year-to-year increase in a decade and one of the biggest gains in Montana, according to data released March 23 by the U.S. Census Bureau.

The board, staff, and the community that supports the Flathead Land Trust all have a similar vision. Each of us are environmentally conscious residents concerned about saving open space and farmland, preserving community character, protecting wild-life habitat, and conserving the natural value of the valley. The Board of the Flathead Land Trust recognizes the correlation between mission, strategy, and board composition, and they understand the importance of fresh perspectives. We have a plan. Focus is powerful.

Get your hiking boots and bike ready because there's a new trail that is being constructed this summer connecting Whitefish to Whitefish Mountain Resort through Haskill Basin. The new Haskill Trail will be located on two pieces of important conserved private land - the Haskill Basin conservation easement owned by F.H. Stoltze Land & Lumber Co. and the Iron Horse conservation easement which is held by the Flathead Land Trust.

This exciting trail project will add two new trailheads and 5.5 miles to the Whitefish Trail system thanks to the partnership of Whitefish Legacy Partners (WLP), the City of Whitefish, Iron Horse, Flathead Land Trust, and Winter Sports, Inc.

The lower trailhead will be located on City of Whitefish land at the water treatment plant on Reservoir Road, within a half mile of the paved bike path on Wisconsin Ave. The new trail will go north through the City of Whitefish property and the Iron Horse conservation easement. It will then continue along the western portion of the 3,022-acre Haskill Basin conservation easement which was completed in 2016 with the help of the Trust for Public Land and Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks with F.H. Stoltze to protect the working timber lands, recreational access and the Whitefish community water supply. The trail will then access the upper trailhead which will be located on Winter Sports Inc. land near Whitefish Mountain Resort. The Upper Haskill Trailhead, in partnership with Glacier Nordic, will have groomed cross country ski access during the winter.

The 51-acre conservation easement on the Iron Horse

property provides a key link of protected land that helps make this trail project possible. "Connecting the trail from Whitefish and the paved bike path along Wisconsin Avenue would not be possible without the Iron Horse/Flathead Land Trust conservation easement parcel. This property provides a perfect link into the area, and the trail experience on these lands will be one enjoyed by the most users" explains WLP Executive Director, Heidi Van Everen.

The Iron Horse conservation easement project was completed in 2000 as a partnership between Flathead Land Trust and the City of Whitefish to creatively protect open space and future public trail access. The City of Whitefish had required conservation of this open space and future access as a condition of approval of the Iron Horse subdivision. Through partnership with the City of Whitefish and the Iron Horse development, Flathead Land Trust was able to ensure this open space and future public access would be maintained in perpetuity with the conservation easement. These community benefits are now culminating in the construction of the Haskill Trail through the property this summer.

This is the second project Flathead Land Trust has been involved with which has facilitated the Whitefish Trail system. The Lupfer Loop of the Whitefish Trail is located









on a 570-acre conservation easement held by Flathead Land Trust which was conserved in partnership with the Stillwater Land Company in 2002. The property was conserved to protect its native wetland and intact forested habitat important for a rich diversity of wildlife species. Mike Goquen purchased the property in 2006 and entered into a land exchange with the State of Montana in 2009 which resulted in the present trail system being established when it became State land. The Lupfer trail is 4 miles long and includes a 3-mile loop through forest interspersed by wetlands and a spur trail to a scenic viewpoint of the Salish Range and Stillwater Valley.

On May 9th, we celebrated the convergence of community, trails, and conservation at the groundbreaking ceremony for the new Haskill Trail. Without a doubt, the biggest benefit of the Whitefish Trail is that it brings community together through conservation and recreation on one of our greatest assets – an intact and beautiful landscape. Flathead Land Trust is proud to play at least a small part in ensuring the protection of this legacy in partnership with the community, Whitefish Legacy Partners and many others.





### - 2016 ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL SUMMARY-

This past year, your support helped conserve 77 acres of farmland and wildlife habitat along the North Shore of Flathead Lake with MT Fish, Wildlife and Parks; conserved 155 acres along the Flathead River in partnership with Montana Land Reliance; secured a 200 acre conservation easement near Bigfork; protect 75 acres of important grizzly bear habitat in the Mission Valley in partnership with the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribe; and released a new Conservation Plan which will guide our future conservation work in northwest Montana.
